SCHOOL ADMISSIONS

You should apply now, online at: www.harrow.gov.uk/schooladmissions or www.eadmissions.org.uk for both **Infant School** (current Nursery pupils) and **Junior School** (current Year 2 pupils) places for September 2018. Closing date is **15th January 2018**.

If your child was born between 1st September 2014 and 31st August 2015, you can apply now for a Nursery place for September 2018. Closing date is 26th February 2018; forms are available from the school office.

Curriculum Presentations

There have recently been meetings for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 parents to explain the curriculum, give details of the children's learning in school and offer advice on how to support children's learning at home. These were well attended and we hope they were informative — we certainly had some positive feedback.

Assemblies and Celebrations

We do a number of different assemblies that the children attend.

Achievements Assembly: children can bring certificates and awards for something they have done outside of school. Teachers also give out Achievement Certificates in relation to something that has occurred during the week.

Class Assembly: the class will do a short presentation/performance on work they have been doing or an event that has happened.

Other Assemblies involve stories to make children think — stories with a moral about friendship, understanding differences and similarities between us all, what to do about a problem.

Assemblies will also reflect on events that have happened in school or in the news. They will also pick up on any cultural/religious events or celebrations — acknowledging that in school we are all part of a diverse community but all come together as members of the Pinner Park community.
